This is just a heads up that today is Microsoft's Patch Tuesday or as we like to call it Black Tuesday. Just know that over the next couple of nights your Windows based computer(s) will be updating and patching themselves via the Windows Automatic Update process and rebooting. Therefore be sure not to leave any files open or unsaved at the end of the day which is sound advice any time. A couple of the patches have a pretty high rating of "PATCH NOW" so it might not be a bad idea to go ahead and patch your computer manually. This can be accomplished by using either the "Windows Update" or "Microsoft Update" function built into windows.
