Hello CNR,

Sun has just released a new update of Java (Version 6 Update 19). This update patches 7 "Highly Critical" security holes. **I highly recommend everyone update all of your computers ASAP!** Please follow the appropriate steps below to install this update. Note that it should only take a few minutes and will not require a restart. Thanks and as always please do not hesitate to [contact us](#) for questions or problems. Lon.

**Updating Java in Windows XP:** (Allow any Integrity Client or Spybot Search & Destroy pop-ups asking for permission during this process)

1. Launch the "Control Panel".
2. Double click on the "Java" applet, if there isn't one then you do not have Java installed and can stop here.
3. Click on the "Update" tab in the "Java Control Panel" that appears.
4. Click on the "Update Now" button.
5. Install any update that it finds but read each screen carefully before clicking on any "Next" buttons. At least on my computer it wanted to "Install the Bing Toolbar" by default which I don't want so I unchecked it.

6. You will also probably be prompted to close the “Java Control Panel” before continuing.
7. Close the “Control Panel”.
8. Done.

**Updating Java in Windows 7:** (Allow any User Account Control or Spybot Search & Destroy pop-ups asking for permission during this process)

1. Launch the “Control Panel”.
2. Click on the “Java (32 bit)” applet, if there isn’t one then you do not have Java installed and can stop here.
3. Click on the “Update” tab in the “Java Control Panel” that appears.
4. Click on the “Update Now” button.
5. Install any update that it finds but read each screen carefully before clicking on any “Next” buttons. At least on my computer it wanted to “Install the Bing Toolbar” by default which I don’t want so I unchecked it.
6. You will also probably be prompted to close the “Java Control Panel” before continuing.
7. Close the “Control Panel”.
8. Done.
