RealNetworks has announced and patched multiple “highly critical” vulnerabilities in their RealPlayer product. If left unpatched and you visit a maliciously formed website you could lose control of your computer. I realize that this is not a very predominant player on in our college but I do know that at least a few of you have it installed. **If you are a user of their product or even just have it installed then I highly recommend either uninstalling it or updating it as soon as possible.** It can be uninstalled from the “Add or Remove Programs” applet within the “Control Panel” or updated by going to www.realplayer.com. I don’t have RealPlayer installed on any of my computers but if I remember right if you have it installed you should have a program group with “Real” in the name under the “Start” menu or you could look to see if it is listed in the “Add or Remove Programs” applet from within the “Control Panel”.

I just found out that tomorrow Microsoft is “supposedly” going to release a patch for the Internet Explorer vulnerability that I wrote about yesterday. If and when that happens I will let everyone know. Thanks. Lon.
