Hello CNRE,

This one is for Windows users only.

Earlier this month a couple of Zero-Day (currently being exploited) vulnerabilities in Apple's QuickTime for Windows were released. **Apple no longer supports QuickTime for Windows so the recommendation from the security experts is to uninstall it!** QuickTime is not something we install on Windows based computers out of our office so most likely not many of you are vulnerable unless you installed it yourself at some point. Having said that it is definitely worth a look in your "Programs and Features" Control Panel applet to see if QuickTime is installed. If it is then you should uninstall it ASAP. Thanks.
